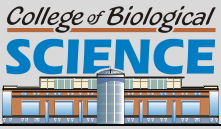




The 11th Annual CBS Graduate Student Symposium

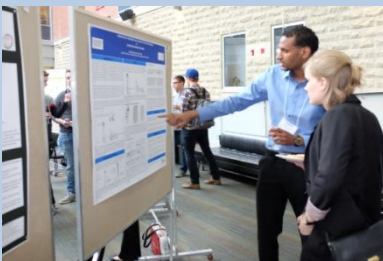
Where: The University of Guelph.
